

Catholic Charities Oneida/Madison County is a host site for Food Bank of Central New York's Food \$en\$e program.

Food \$en\$e is a monthly food buying co-op for anyone who wants to stretch their grocery dollars. This program provides a monthly box of 12-15 staple grocery items at a discounted price.

There are no qualifications, no subscription, and no requirements to participate.

Each package costs \$20.50 without limitation to the number of packages you may buy.

Items vary month to month with rotating specials.





